For the certainty and security of our forest industry and working with the sector, being the process of unlocking the 'Wood Bank' – the Future Potential Production Forest and the 27 parcels of FPPF land totalling about 39,000 hectares of largely regrowth forest, as outlined in Section 7 of the Rebuilding the Forestry Industry Act 2014. This will give a 10 per cent boost to the annual supply of high-quality sawlog to Tasmanian sawmillers and extend contracts to 2040, including for plantation supply.
