The Great Eastern Drive has been upgraded in stages since 2018 with funding continuing for the next 4-5 years. As part of the continuing \$35 million funding, the Department has invested in three passing lanes on the Tasman Highway over the last two years along with widening and safety treatments at entries to popular tourism experiences.

The Bass Highway is a key facilitator of Tasmania's economic growth, carrying the highest freight tonnages of any section of Tasmania's land transport network, at an estimated value of over \$3.8 billion in 2008/09. The Highway connects Tasmania's two highest volume sea ports, major agricultural, processing and industrial areas, and is a key inter-regional link for freight and passengers. Reflecting the strategic function of the Highway, the Tasmanian Government's objective in planning and managing this Freight Corridor is to provide an efficient and safe road network that supports improved productivity and efficiency between, the northern export ports, freight generating areas and distribution centres.

While Wielangta Road has significance to Parks and Wildlife Service for access to Wielangta Forest, and Glamorgan-Spring Bay and Sorell Councils for local access, it is not a State road. Any further suggestions should be directed to Tasmania Parks and Wildlife Service and Glamorgan-Spring Bay Council.



I inspected the landslide this afternoon; and make the following comments:

The landslide probably occurred as a result of scour or saturation of the fill during heavy rain. The landslide is immediately downslope and across the road from a large culvert inlet (1500mm?). The culvert has an angle change about halfway across the road and has no light showing from the outlet. The outlet could not be located and is presumed buried in the landslide debris. The inlet is only about one third open.

The landslide has mainly moved loose fill from the embankment leaving the main road construction materials in place. There are no cracks behind the main scarp, but cracking extends laterally for several metres either side of the area that has failed.


It is assessed that fixing this slide is a substantial project that would not be easy with the current increased loads on Weilangta Road.


It is suggested that a barrier is placed along the current line of bollards such that a vehicle losing control in the area would have a lower chance of falling into the landslide area. The barrier should curve in at the ends to reduce the chance of an impact at the end of the line of barriers.

Placing the barriers along the current line of bollards would put the barriers approximately 1m from the landslide scarp and leave approximately 6.5m width of trafficable road.





Regarding the Tasman Highway road closure and subsequent public use of Wielangta Road as an alternative for east coast travellers to access Hobart or the coast. The Wielangta Road is a dirt road of varying conditions.

Communications along the road via mobile phone are effectively not available for most of its length.

Last week it was determined that roadside distance markers would be beneficial along Wielangta Road to aid dispatch services in particular (TASPOL, TFS, AT) to assess location of any incidents through request for caller to access the appropriate roadside number. They of course would need to travel to a reception location.

Department of State Growth have kindly supported this request by arranging the installation of "Kilometre" markers (see attached photos for clarity).

The start point for estimating distances, i.e. zero location, is the junction of Kellevie Road and Arthur Highway just prior to Copping (UTM 55 G0564684E 5259186N).

On Wielangta road the first obvious marker is "6 kilometre" just prior to the Wielangta Road and Bream Creek Road intersection. On Wielangta Road itself the first marker is "7" (UTM 55 G0567904E 5264093N) just up from the junction. There is then a marker placed every kilometre up to the junction with Wielangta Road and Rheban Road in Orford. The numbering terminates as "35".

Geo tagging of each marker has been done and will be collated and passed on tomorrow.

Please notify your respective dispatch services, etc, etc. as you see fit.

As a result of the closure of Tasman Highway at Paradise Gorge this weekend it is expected that Wielangta road may become a significantly utilised alternative for the public to access the east coast area.

It has been assessed as a difficult area for communications for the public and emergency services with limited phone coverage or clear landmarks.

Concerns have been raised as to how the public could efficiently articulate an approximate location for any emergency incidents that may occur throughout the Wielangta road zone.

It has been determined that road distance markers may assist the public to reasonably supply locality information to emergency services for incident location throughout the length of the road.

The suggestion is for clearly visible and appropriately signed kilometre markers (for example), from whichever direction, that would greatly aid location information for emergency services. Each marker would also have its Grid Reference obtained and this can be provided to Emergency Services dispatch centres to aid in directing critical support to any given emergency incident. This would be beneficial for all dispatch centres and could benefit DSG road crews.

For public clarity clear highlighting of purpose on each sign would be required.

Could the Department of State Growth please consider installing said markers for the duration of the Paradise Gorge road closure.

This action would greatly improve community safety and aid emergency services personnel as well as services such as for breakdowns, tow trucks, etc. It will need to be initiated as soon as is practicable from the start of road closure.

If you could please advise if this concept could be arranged.

I am a resident of Orford and travel to and from Sorell and Hobart on a regular basis, both privately and as a volunteer for CTST.

You will be aware that driving between dusk and dawn is absolutely unadvisable because of the large numbers of native animals that have no respect for our road rules. A journey to Hobart will now take in excess of three hours, on a good day with good traffic conditions. Currently this would allow about 2.5 hours in Hobart to attend medical and other appointments.

People who live on the East Coast, and visit the area, have long complained about the Tasman Highway area at Paradise, and have long lobbied for the sealing of the Wielangta Road. It is ridiculous that tourists and residents travelling to the East Coast from the south should be reliant on a single narrow road through a gorge which is regularly closed in inclement weather because of rock and waterfalls.

There is no mention in current projects about the Wielangta Road, which should be listed as a Project of State Significance. Other projects on the list seem to be fairly frivolous, to my mind.

Please pass my comments to somebody responsible, in more ways than one.

I am writing to confirm our phone discussions on 27 and 28th May 202.

We are aware that Wielangta Road has multiple owners and land tenure along its length. State Roads is not one of them.

Given the current circumstances, with the temporary closure of the Tasman Highway, while we are not promoting Wielangta Road as the preferred detour route, it is shorter and is already a general access road, so there is no doubt that some people will choose to use it as an alternative to Midland Highway and Lake Leake Road.

In recognition of the current suboptimal condition of the road for higher volumes of traffic, the Department of State Growth has engaged its contractors to undertake grading and re-sheeting on the most deteriorated three kilometre section of road and other works such as the installation of new warning signage, a 60 km speed limit and additional guide posts. The road will be inspected daily, and Transport Inspectors will also have a presence at either end of the road to monitor traffic and the 4 WD warning signs will remain in place.

The Department will continue to monitor and maintain Wielangta Road for the duration of the closure of the Tasman Highway, but after that the expectation is that it will return to the management of the various owners.

I trust this addresses your concerns.

As a result of the closure of Tasman Highway at Paradise Gorge this weekend it is expected that Wielangta road may become a significantly utilised alternative for the public to access the east coast area.

It has been assessed as a difficult area for communications for the public and emergency services with limited phone coverage or clear landmarks.

Concerns have been raised as to how the public could efficiently articulate an approximate location for any emergency incidents that may occur throughout the Wielangta road zone.

It has been determined that road distance markers may assist the public to reasonably supply locality information to emergency services for incident location throughout the length of the road.

The suggestion is for clearly visible and appropriately signed kilometre markers (for example), from whichever direction, that would greatly aid location information for emergency services. Each marker would also have its Grid Reference obtained and this can be provided to Emergency Services dispatch centres to aid in directing critical support to any given emergency incident. This would be beneficial for all dispatch centres and could benefit DSG road crews.

For public clarity clear highlighting of purpose on each sign would be required.

Could the Department of State Growth please consider installing said markers for the duration of the Paradise Gorge road closure.

This action would greatly improve community safety and aid emergency services personnel as well as services such as for breakdowns, tow trucks, etc. It will need to be initiated as soon as is practicable from the start of road closure.

If you could please advise if this concept could be arranged.

Flood and Storm Emergencies Call 132 500

As a result of the closure of Tasman Highway at Paradise Gorge this weekend it is expected that Wielangta road may become a significantly utilised alternative for the public to access the east coast area.

It has been assessed as a difficult area for communications for the public and emergency services with limited phone coverage or clear landmarks.

Concerns have been raised as to how the public could efficiently articulate an approximate location for any emergency incidents that may occur throughout the Wielangta road zone.

It has been determined that road distance markers may assist the public to reasonably supply locality information to emergency services for incident location throughout the length of the road.

The suggestion is for clearly visible and appropriately signed kilometre markers (for example), from whichever direction, that would greatly aid location information for emergency services. Each marker would also have its Grid Reference obtained and this can be provided to Emergency Services dispatch centres to aid in directing critical support to any given emergency incident. This would be beneficial for all dispatch centres and could benefit DSG road crews.

For public clarity clear highlighting of purpose on each sign would be required.

Could the Department of State Growth please consider installing said markers for the duration of the Paradise Gorge road closure.

This action would greatly improve community safety and aid emergency services personnel as well as services such as for breakdowns, tow trucks, etc. It will need to be initiated as soon as is practicable from the start of road closure.

If you could please advise if this concept could be arranged.





Drones and laser surveillance of the area was considered to be the most efficient and least impactful method of surveying the area. This work has identified a significant risk of rock slippage, this rock would need to be removed to ensure stability and a safe and trafficable environment. Further investigation in the area is required. It is anticipated that the removal of the rock would be completed in two stages.

Stage 1 – safe line attached, remove lose rocks and foliage to determine access and priority for removal. Partial and intermittent lane and road closures for one week to complete work. This time is also expected to scope out work required for full removal of the rocks.

Stage 2 – jersey barriers and pea gravel in place for removal of larger rocks. Heritage wall is expected to be protected by the jersey barriers and pea gravel. Removal of the larger rocks is expected to be completed by use of airbags. Breakdown of rocks for cartage would be drilled and blasted under control. It is expected that a significant amount of rock will fall into the river. This stage of work is expected to take up to 12 weeks. A factor affecting the works will be the winter weather and may affect up to 30% of the time. A full road closure would be required during this stage.

Observation of the activity by the public should be discouraged on land and in the adjacent river. PWS may need to be advised for closure of the watercourse in area.

Water pipe in the area was considered to not be in the area of impact.

Advice of weather events is rainfall that could create runoff or that is up to 10mm of rain per hour or 20mm over a day will be significant enough to require a road closure. If using the Orford weather station a temperature at or below 3 degrees would be considered enough to cause frost in the vicinity of affected area and require a road closure.



Andrew Roberts asked me to provide you with an updated on the responsibilities for maintenance of Wielangta Road.

Below is an e-mail I prepared around this time last year and the issues around ownership and maintenance have not changed. The condition of the road has just deteriorated further.

While the maintenance of the northern section is now clear and resolved, the responsibility of the southern section is still not clear.

It could be argued that Sorell Council, with ratepayers along this section should be responsible to maintain like other rural gravel roads in their municipality (including Bream Creek Road which Wielangta Road comes off).

Similarly it could be argued that Sustainable Timbers Tasmania and private timber companies like Forico are responsible for the road as it is used to access production forests. The road was originally put in by the forestry industry and over the years was maintained by North Forest Products, Gunns and then Forestry Tasmania for the

entire length. Since the Forest Agreement and Forestry Tas (now Sustainable Timbers Tas) started focusing on timber production and minimising its 'community obligations' these type of 'tourist' or 'public access' roads were not seen as a priority for maintenance or not key responsibility of STT. Similarly with the closure of the Triabunna Mill there was no longer a need for road by the forestry industry to transport logs from the Tasman Peninsula to the mill. STT also have no legal responsibility to maintain roads to the standard expect of state growth or council road for public use. So they are happy to let the condition deteriorate until they need to access timber and then they will repair as needed.

Some people, including Sorell argue that the PWS should or is maintaining the road. Since the forest agreement PWS has been given responsibility for the Future Potential Production Forest Lands (FPPFL) along with roads on that land (that would have previously been managed by STT). So there is a section in the middle on FPPF land that is the responsibility of PWS to maintain (see maps attached). We have replaced a bridge in this section as part of the upgrade works in the northern section (recognising the responsibility for this bridge sat with us). There is likely to be an internal PWS funding request for maintenance funds for this section of road in next financial year (with no guarantees it will be funded over other priority maintenance works) but even if this was upgraded the majority of the southern section would not be maintained and still up for debate in terms of who is responsible for maintaining. There has always been a hesitation by PWS to do any major works because we don't want to reinforce the notion it is 'our' road through the actions of actively maintaining sections of it. The works we did at the northern end was at the request of the Government in order to secure an agreement with Council for ongoing maintenance,

The only major change to the e-mail status below is that there has recently been warning signage installed advising that the road is suitable for 4WD only in some sections (see attached). Three signs have been installed, one at each end and one in the middle near Rheban Road (for those coming from the North at Orford this is the last obvious turn around point).

Hi Jason,

Here is a collection of Wielangta Road related information/briefings I have prepared in the last few months as the condition of the southern end of the road in the Sorell Municipality has started to gain some media interest given then clear difference in the condition of the road since the upgrades have been completed for the full length fo the Glamorgan Spring Bay section to the Council boundary.

I am not aware of anything that has changed since November when we were scrambling to work out what it would cost to upgrade the remaining/poorly maintained section within the Sorell Municipality (I'll forward a separate e-mail which provides cost estimates).

The issue always seems to come back to 'who's road is it?' and 'who is going to upgrade the bad sections?' While the questions seem pretty simple the answers are complex:

Ownership vs Management

- 'Ownership' of Wielangta Road is a difficult to resolve without potentially hundreds of thousands of dollars on surveys, potential land transfers, declaration of new road reserves or entering into legal agreements for access over private land etc.
- The Surveyor General advised against 'sorting the ownership' early in the project and suggested focusing on who was responsible for the ongoing management/maintenance of the road (which is much easier to define).

Northern Section

- The management of the northern section (from the Glamorgan Spring Bay Council and Sorell Council Boundary through to Orford) is quite clear now it is the responsibility of Glamorgan Spring Bay Council.
- It has been GSB Council's responsibility since they declared the road a 'Highway' under the Local Government Highways Act in the Government Gazette and added it to their database/GIS system of roads they manage.
- GSB Council made the declaration and agreed to take on the ongoing maintenance liability as a result of
 extended negotiations with PWS and eventually through a grant deed that involved PWS (on behalf of the
 State Government) replacing 4 bridges in need of replacement and providing a grant to GSB Council of
 approx. \$800K to upgrade the road surface, improve drainage, clear vegetation (and effectively bring up to
 the standard for a rural unsealed road suitable for 2WD vehicles).
- As a result of the grant deed and road works completed last year the northern section of Wielangta Road (which is approximately 21km to the Council boundary) is in good condition and suitable for 2WD vehicles.

Southern Section

- The PWS attempted similar negotiations with the Sorell Council but Sorell have on several occasions indicated they have no interest or financial capacity to take on the maintenance liability for Wielangta Road without an ongoing annual contribution to cover the maintenance costs for the road.
- The southern section (in Sorelly Municipality) which is approximately 7km from the Council Boundary to Bream Creek Road is in parts not suitable for 2WD vehicles.
- The worst section of the road is closest to the Council boundary. When last inspected (around November 2018) there appeared to be some roadworks undertaken on the first 5-6km of the road from Bream Creek to the point where a logging coupe had recently been logged. A couple of months prior to this there were some enquiries to PWS about the ownership/maintenance liability of the southern section by Forico (who manage a lot of the forestry land in the area). Therefore it is assumed that Forico conducted these logging operations and upgraded the road to support the logging activity). As a result there is a section in the middle approximately 1-2km that has had no work for a number of years and is in poor condition. The road is probably no worse than before all these negotiations began because during the bridge replacements there were some basic road maintenance works (filling potholes and some grading) undertaken to allow the trucks to access the two southern bridge replacement site. However as time passes this section of road will continue to deteriorate.
- Around November last year PWS provided some estimates of what it might cost to upgrade the remaining section of the road in poor condition (I can forward these separately again if needed).

Signage

- There is some very minor signage at the start of the road near Orford saying it is a gravel road and conditions are subject to change (a standard yellow sign you see at the start of a lot of gravel roads). The same signage is at the Southern end near Bream Creek Road.
- This signs have been in place since Forestry Tas used to manage the road, and as a result some people tend to ignore them, tourists included.
- Internally we have discussed the issue of signage and the change in condition of the road particularly for visitors coming from the north the point at which the road deteriorates is a considerable distance from the most obvious alternate route (20km) and a considerable way from any intersection with other routes for return (ie Rheban Road approx. 10km back from the Council Boundary and 10km from Orford). As a result most tourists once they discover the change in road condition, particularly those with GPS would potentially just look at the distance remaining and decide to proceed through the 'bad' section. So there certainly is a case for 'warning' signs but where this should be provided and who should install/maintain the signs would

need to be negotiated with GSB Council in the north and potentially Sorell Council and/or Forico in the south.

After preparing this quick summary I prepared a range of maps to show where I though the worst section of the road is and how this relates to land tenure/management responsibility.

Without taking a GPS or actual measurements during the last inspection, I prepared the attached maps in the LIST (you can follow the links below to take you to the list to zoom in to individual parcels of land, overlay additional LIST layers etc)

First map is a quick summary of major parcels of land, tenure and my guess at where the worst bit is.

From the maps attached my guess would be the worst section of the road is FPPF Land managed by us or Permanent Timber Production Zone Land which is still lists as Forestry Tas (I'm assuming Sustainable Timbers Tas now) as the managing authority (see the blue line over the road for my guess of where it is the poor section).




W Road detail tenure 1





Thank you for the correspondence of 8 July 2020 to the Honorable Sarah Courtney MP, Minister for Small Business in relation to your submission to the Rebuild a Stronger Tasmania Small Business Seminar.

In my capacity as Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, I am pleased to respond to some of the issues you have raised in relation to the Arthur Highway and Wielangta Road.

The Tasmanian Government recognises the importance of the Arthur Highway in providing safe and efficient access to the local community and visitors to regional tourist attractions.

The Tasmanian Government is improving the safety of the Arthur Highway at Eaglehawk Neck as part of the Visitor Economy Roads Package. The project includes widening the existing lanes of the Arthur Highway between Old Jetty Road and Blowhole Road, improving the road surface and providing improved turning facilities out of Blowhole Road.

The Project will also make provision for an on-road pathway between the Dog Line Memorial and Blowhole Road. This pathway is part of a larger community-led project being completed in stages from the Tessellated Pavementcar park to the Tasman Arch. Construction is likely to begin in early 2021.

The Department of State Growth is trialling the implementation of roadside stopping bays for slow moving vehicles on the Arthur Highway between south of Murdunna and north of Eaglehawk Neck overtaking lanes. These upgrades are expected to reduce the reported delays and driver frustration due to slow moving vehicles. Preliminary work and investigations are currently progressing and construction is likely to begin in early 2021.

The Department has also advised me that two sites on the Arthur Highway, north of Flinders Creek Bridge, are programmed to undergo road surface renewal during the summer, when the weather is warmer.

In addition, a 3.6 km section of the Arthur Highway, between Gangells Road, Forcett and Blue Hills Road, Copping, is scheduled for resurfacing over the 2020-21 financial year. A targeted maintenance works program for the Arthur Highway is also being prepared by the Department with works to be undertaken this spring.

The work is part of the Government's ongoing commitment to maintain the State road network, which comprises approximately 3 700 kilometres of road and 1 300 bridges.

Wielangta Road is not part of the State road network, but is owned and managed by a combination of Tasmania Parks and Wildlife Service, Sustainable Timber Tasmania and Glamorgan-Spring Bay Council.



We appreciate the opportunity to make a submission for the seminar you are conducting today, on behalf of the Government. We have addressed five key issues - details below.

We have approached our submission in terms of the bigger picture, with a focus on the development of community capacity. This will enable private enterprise to invest with confidence due to the advantages that stronger local communities (particularly in the public realm), contribute to successful outcomes.

This submission includes investments which are specific to the Tasman Peninsula and others that can be applied statewide.

1. Arthur Highway - Sorell to Port Arthur (including the loop Taranna-Premaydena-Nubeena-Port

The traffic levels on this road have increased significantly over the past 30 years. Over this period of time there have been improvements in sections of this road. However, the majority of the highway remains unchanged.

With a lack of straight sections of road suitable for overtaking and steep gradients, long lines of traffic develop behind trucks, camper-vans and other slow moving vehicles. This creates dangerous driving conditions on the road and significant traffic delays. When combined with the opening bridge at Dunalley, this road is an impediment to smooth traffic flow and a safety hazard.

A significant commitment is required to upgrade this key piece of infrastructure.

As noted below, a major key to economic development is enabling opportunities for all regions and increasing visitation duration. The Tasman Peninsula has traditionally been a day trip for many visitors. Whilst this is now beginning to change, an improved road network is necessary to maximise opportunities. The last major upgrade to the Nubeena-Taranna section of this road was carried out in the mid-1970s.

2. Wielangta Road

Efforts have been made to seal parts of the road. However, it is quite dangerous and is extremely unsuitable for tourism traffic. This road needs to be urgently rebuilt and sealed for its entire length.

If you consider that across the nation, interconnections between regions is a key driver of economic development, this section of road has the potential to improve traffic flow around the State and assist the various Tasmanian tourism regions to promote their offerings.

It is critical that we make it as easy as possible to plan out a journey, often within quite tight timeframes. To minimise the crossover of the various visitor routes, we will increase the ability for our local economy to benefit from intrastate, interstate and overseas visitation. New Zealand is a master at this and they have trips of varying lengths to suit almost every visitor's available time.

3. Lack of Social/Public Housing

The lack of affordable housing has been a concern for quite some time. It is apparent that it has also contributed to problems recruiting suitably skilled workers of the Tasman region. Housing is very scarce and it is restricting the ability of people to move to the area for work.

Government investment to provide additional housing and to stimulate growth is a very real opportunity.

4. Town centre and infrastructure development

Across the Peninsula, the growth of town centres has largely been organic, with a lack of cohesive planning. We are aware that the Tasman Council has developed structure plans for the Peninsula and we believe State Government support for them, with strategic investments in infrastructure, will greatly assist regional economic development. Private investment can then be made with increased confidence and in line with regional competitive advantage.

An assessment of the economic benefits that will be derived from access to sewerage, water and reliable electricity supplies needs to be undertaken. As the Peninsula is on a single direction power line, power failures during extreme weather events and fires is a major impediment to successful economic development. The lack of sewage and town water supplies is a major inhibitor of growth. It creates urban sprawl and poor planning outcomes.

5. Technical and vocational education

There is currently minimal training available on the Tasman Peninsula, for local residents. Greater use of facilities within the area - including at the Tasman School - could be achieved and contribute to driving economic outcomes. The use of video teleconferencing would be a vital part of the solution and provide cost effective outcomes. Broadband capacity is essential to ensure success of this learning infrastructure and may require state government investment. However, with the rapidly increasing move toward the provision of online services within both private enterprise and government, improved access to high-speed internet and addressing the problems of the digital divide will be well served by further investment in this infrastructure at a local level.

Thank you for your email dated 24 June 2020, following up on my response to you about upgrades to Wielangta Road.

Tasmania PWS is the Tasmania Parks and Wildlife Service. I apologise for not expanding it in the first instance in my previous response.

Infrastructure development, building and construction will play a key role in our economic recovery across Tasmania, by injecting money into local communities, supporting existing employment, and creating new jobs.

In addition to the already significant capital program, the Tasmanian and Australian Governments have recently committed an additional \$74 million for roads and bridges safety upgrades and renewals over the next two years, bringing the total roads and bridges Capital Investment Program value to \$827 million between now and the end of 2021-22.

This is part of the Tasmanian Government's \$1.8 billion job-creating infrastructure investment which has an estimated construction value of \$3.1 billion.

With regard to your suggested improvements, it is important to note that roads across Tasmania are owned by a range of road managers, including the Tasmanian Government, local councils and government businesses and authorities. As Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, I have responsibility for the State road network, which is owned and managed by the Department of State Growth.

The State road network primarily consists of key passenger and freight transport routes that connect cities, major towns, rural catchments and key marine and air transport hubs.

The Department has advised me that while Wielangta Road has significance to the Parks and Wildlife Service for access to Wielangta Forest, and Glamorgan-Spring Bay and Sorell Councils for local access, it is not a State road.

I suggest that any future concerns regarding this issue be directed to Tasmania Parks and Wildlife Service and Glamorgan-Spring Bay Council.

I have received representations from constituents living on the part of Wielangta Road in the Sorell municipality.

As you are aware, this road is a former forestry road and it has fallen into disrepair. Your Government offered this road to the two Councils that cover this road. Glamorgan Spring Bay Council took on responsibility for the section within their municipality but Sorell Council decided not to take responsibility for the part of the road that falls within their municipality. If you have travelled along this road you will notice the Glamorgan Spring Bay Council have upgraded their part of the road but the part in the Sorell Municipality has not been improved for a long time.

Parts of Wielangta Road in the Sorell municipality are now in a dangerous condition. In these areas the road is only passable by four wheel drive vehicles and I am informed even then it is extremely difficult to navigate. There is no mobile reception in the area and if any incident occurred help would only come from a passing vehicle.

If emergency assistance is required vehicles would also struggle to attend. The winter weather is also making the state of the road even worse. As well as this, during the dry months should a fire break out in this wooded area emergency vehicles would find it difficult to attend.

Tasmanians are being encouraged to travel around the State to boost the economy. Some satellite navigation systems still direct people to take this road that connects Copping to the Tasman Highway up the east coast. In the past tourists have become stuck on the road relying on residents to assist them.

I would be grateful if you could provide feedback on what will be done to maintain this part of Wielangta Road to ensure the safety of residents and tourists alike.

We write to express our concern and our views regarding the Wielangta Road between Kellevie and Orford.

We would like to extend our family business into the East Coast, delivering milk and cheese from our farm at Bream Creek to Orford, Triabunna and potentially further north. However, the state of the Wielangta Road is such that we would be unable to drive our truck though without significant risk, and vehicle wear and tear that would negate the benefits of expanding our business up the coast.

As you know, we have been dairy farmers in Bream Creek for almost sixty years, proudly producing high quality milk and growing our business from a twelve-cow farm to the 800-head enterprise we operate today. We wish to build on that growth but are hampered by the neglect of the Wielangta road.

It seems counterintuitive to waste the recent significant investment made by the Government to upgrade the bridges on the road, as well as the considerable rhetoric regarding its potential as a tourist route. Since that upgrade, the Southern end of the road has degraded badly, making it almost impossible to even reach the newly developed bridges.

We are not necessarily asking for the road to be sealed, but it is in the interests of us and no doubt other small businesses in the greater Sorell district for there to be significant works undertaken that will ensure the safety of drivers in all vehicles.

Dear Mr Ferguson

I write in relation to the Wielangta Road. For some years now this road has been promoted on various websites, including government, as an ideal alternative for tourists as a link between the East Coast and the Tasman Peninsula. Premier Will Hodgman described it at one point as an important extension to the newly badged Great Eastern Drive. By spending over 2 million dollars on bridge replacements in recent

years, I would expect that the government would want to capitalise on that investment. To promote the road in its present condition is negligent.

As a regular user of that road for 30 years, I feel well qualified to say that I have never seen so many vehicles on it as there are currently. The majority of users are tourists, no doubt lured onto the road by the glowing descriptions used on the internet. In many cases the caravans, camper trailers, boats and international drivers are not suited or prepared for the 1.5 metre wide, 25 cm deep potholes, nor the sections of the road which are rutted or down to road base. It is not uncommon for cars to be on the wrong side of the road on blind bends in an attempt to avoid massive potholes or overgrown roadside vegetation. Having recently been involved in what could have easily been a fatal accident, I have grave concerns for a more disastrous outcome in the future with the inevitable increase in traffic.

I understand there is a stand-off between the Sorell Council and the State Government over who will take responsibility for the road. I would suggest while both these parties are failing to take action, lives are at risk. With the peak tourist season upon us I implore the Government to do something about this small but important road.

I remind you of the promises that have been made over the last few years regarding the Wielangta Road. See below:
